

Art, the Universal Language

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q. I can't get the entry form off the website. I can't access the pdf. Can you send me the entry form?

Q. How many pieces can I enter?

A. Each artist may submit one piece of art.

Q. What constitutes a disability?

A. We have not defined disability for purposes of the art contest. If you consider yourself to have a disability, you are welcome to submit an entry.

Q. How much hand-over-hand assistance can an artist receive and still enter the contest?

A. The idea is that the artwork is an original piece by the artist. If the artist's disability requires hand-over-hand assistance to complete the art, the artist can direct the assistant. It is not acceptable for the assistant to direct the artist.

Q. Why isn't there a written word, poetry, or movie category?

A. The contest is limited to these categories: painting, drawing, photography, 3-D, mixed media/other.

Q. Can we send multiple digital images on a single CD with separate entry forms for each artist's submission?

A. Yes, a CD with multiple images from multiple artists is fine, as long as each artist completes a separate entry form (which can also be on the CD) and it is clear which piece of art is from each artist.

Q. Can a group of students submit a single piece of art?

A. Yes, but please clearly identify the names of the students in the group and submit a separate entry form for each student.

Q. What are the prizes?

A. We have not announced what will be presented to the first, second and third place winners.

Q. Will each artist receive a certificate of participation?

A. No. Only first, second, and third place will receive recognition.

Q. If prize winners submit actual pieces for the awards presentation, will the pieces be returned?

A. When we notify the first place winners, we will ask that they send the actual artwork for displaying during the awards ceremony. The artists will take their pieces with them when the ceremony is over.

Q. Do the artists have to pay for the art to be mailed back after the awards ceremony too? Do they HAVE to ship the original?

A. The first place award winners will take their pieces with them when the awards ceremony is over. If an artist does not attend the ceremony, but wants his or her artwork displayed at the ceremony, then the artist would pay for mailing in both directions.
