43	404.9.9 – Co-payment Exceeds Cost of Care	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Corrected the regulatory citation in the 1st paragraph to reflect the revised regulations at § 3041.108(c).
62	404.11.6 – Absence	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Revised 1st paragraph following the regulatory citation to reflect the change in the number of consecutive absences permitted from 10 to 5 and clarified that payment stops on Day 6. Added the regulatory citation regarding the absence cap in a State fiscal year and included explanation that the family remains eligible when a child reaches the maximum number of absences but the CCIS will not pay for absences beginning with the 26th absence. Clarified that the CCIS will zero-out the days of absence, beginning with the 26th day of absence to assure the provider is not paid for any absences beginning with the 26th day of absence. Clarified that provider closures, paid or unpaid, do NOT count as days of absence. Included a reference to the Enrollment & Co-payment chapter, which will include more detailed discussion regarding processing absences.
