Every year in Pennsylvania, thousands of children need safety, security, nurturing, love – all the things kids get from good parenting. If you can open your heart and your home to a child then you might have what it takes to be a foster parent.

It takes a special person to reach out to kids in crisis and unselfishly give them what they need. Some of these kids are very young; some are older; some have siblings. They come from different backgrounds. Whatever their situation, they need a place that is home – for whatever length of time.
