CCT CONNECT

<u>Customized</u> <u>Community</u> <u>Transportation</u>

Scope of Service

Public transportation regulated by state and federal agencies, including the Federal Transportation Administration and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

TRAVELING ON CCT CONNECT

•Vehicles are not equipped with car seats wheelchairs, or attendants.

•There is no same-day or emergency service.

•You cannot choose your driver or vehicle, or specify the route taken by the vehicle.





CCT Program Eligibility



ADA PARATRANSIT SERVICE

- In accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act
- Service for people with disabilities who are functionally unable to use regular accessible fixed-route bus service for some or all of their transportation needs.
- Service mirrors travel on the regular fixed route bus and trolley system.
- Eligible individuals can travel whenever and wherever buses operate in SEPTA's five-county service region.

SHARED-RIDE PROGRAM

- The State of Pennsylvania Lottery Fund contributes to the cost of operating this program.
- Service is for Philadelphia residents who are 65 or older.
- A door-to-door ride-sharing service offered on a space-available basis with limited driver assistance.
- Used to travel within the City of Philadelphia and to anywhere in the surrounding counties within three miles of the city's border.

- •Must have acceptable proof of age
- •Will get SEPTA Senior Key card
