## **PACTT Affiliate Public Report**

Limitations of this report should be noted. In addition, academic data does not include youth having received services for less than 90 days. As a result, the average length of stay for youth in the affiliation areas may differ. Data included in the report was based on self-reported information provided by the affiliated agency. Reports were generated, using the PACTT database, by the affiliate and reviewed by the affiliate for accuracy prior to being posted for public viewing.

Our program is multi-faceted, interweaving academics, trades training, counseling and extra-curricular activities. It provides the transforming environment and unwavering support young juvenile offenders need to redirect their lives.

The MISSION of The Academy Schools is to place students in a positive, productive environment, one which fosters success and nurtures the self accomplishment which naturally follows.

The Academy Schools, though increasing in numbers, have never forgotten their core mission of combining rigorous educational curricula with extensive counseling services, trade skills training and athletics. We seek to capture our students in their finest moments, emphasizing their successes and never letting them revert to anything less than their best.

- Offer at least one (1) of the following basic certificates: OSHA-10, ServSafe, MOS; International Computer Driving License (ICDL).

- Test youth prior to discharge to identify educational gains made.
- Ensure the availability of certified Special Education teachers as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE).
- Provide supports for youth who have special needs in their Individualized Education Program (IEP).
- Provide opportunities for youth to obtain a GED and connect them with post-secondary training and career opportunities.
- Request and transmits school records within the timeframe required by PDE.
- Provide individual case management to support youth's transition to school.
- Provide supports for English Language Learners (ELL).
- Align academic courses and course descriptions with PDE's Pennsylvania Information Management System (PIMS).
- Whenever possible, provide instruction through low youth-to-teacher ratios.
- Provide staff with regular professional development.
