Select providers will receive a rate add-on of 5% per individual served and Clinically Enhanced providers will receive a rate add-on of 8% per individual served. These additional payments only apply to individuals who receive the following waiver services from an eligible provider: Licensed Residential Habilitation; Unlicensed Residential Habilitation; Life Sharing; and Supported Living.
