 - There are no updates on the following that can be shared at this time.

 - Community HealthChoices (CHC) Request for Application (RFA)
 - Was posted to e-Marketplace on January 30, 2024.

 - Independent Enrollment Broker (IEB)
 - Contract has been signed by Maximus and is effective January 1, 2024
 - Currently in the signatory process with the state
 - OLTL will be meeting and working with Maximus to implement the provision of the contract

- Dept. of Aging's Aging Our Way PA (Master Plan on Aging)
 - This plan is designed to establish priorities that will transform the aging services system to promote health, well-being, and independence over the next 10 years and beyond.

 - Social Participation

 - Draft plan was released in the PA Bulletin on February 17th with a 30-day comment period that will end on March 20th.





- Nursing Facility Ineligible (NFI) terms from April 2023 to January 2024 due to not appealing:
 - 9314 Physician Certifications (PC) request sent out
 - 4495 PCs Received
 - 3122 NFI ineligibility notices sent to participants.
 - Remainder are still pending with CAOs
 - 1849 Appeals Received

- Medical Director Review
 - In January, the MDR reviewed 260 cases and found 74 (28%) as NFCE.

- Medical Director Review
 - The Medical Director's team began considering additional information (e.g., the complete InterRAI, service coordinator notes).
 The MCOs have been asked to upload the full InterRAI and SC/UM notes for MDR review as of Feb 12th.
 - Data is not available at the moment to show how many NFI determinations have been reviewed since the change was implemented.
- Physician Certifications not returned within 60 days currently being assessed by Aging Well:
 - 5067 total identified
 - 1301 assessed so far
 - 1017 NFCE (78%)
 - 284 NFI (22%)
 - 411 Could not be reached/refused the assessment
 - This participant list was sent to the MCOs for follow up to explain to the participant the importance of completing the FED and to clarify contact information.

- Terminations:
 - 4070: 1768s were sent to the County Assistance Offices (CAO) and of those;
 - 3122 ineligibility letters were sent
 - Additional outcome data is being assessed for collection
