# **Community Program Updates**



#### **Low-Barrier Crisis Supports**

- Funding for NAMI Keystone to train program instructors and support group leaders. Funding to local affiliates to implement programming.
- Support groups are offered for both family members and peers (in-person and virtually).
- Local NAMI affiliates will provide free 8-week evidence-based educational courses:
  - Family to Family empower family members with an understanding of mental illness and how to support their loved one with a mental illness. The course includes developing a crisis plan for individuals and families.
  - **Peer to Peer** supports people living with a mental illness to understand their diagnosis and how to chart their recovery.
  - **NAMI Basics** supports parents/caregivers of youth to understand the emergence of a mental illness and how to access resources and supports.



#### Safer Communities Gun Violence Intervention Funding

- Millersville University will release an RFP to fund grassroots, non-clinical mental health interventions to support individuals who have experienced gun violence.
- Youth MOVE PA was funded to implement Sources of Strength (SOS) in partnership with schools across the Commonwealth.
- SOS is an evidence-based school culture change curriculum that increases student help-seeking behavior, decreases substance use, and builds more connected school communities.



#### Access to Peer Support and Endorsement Training

- To increase access to peer support, OMHSAS received approval from CMS just this week to change the eligibility requirement to become a Certified Peer Specialist (CPS) from *identifying* as having an SMI to lived experience with a mental health diagnosis.
- OMHSAS is financially supporting increased access to endorsement training for CPSs that include crisis services, forensics, and older adults.
