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

LVHN Health Information Exchange (HIE)

- LVHN has a strong history of supporting HIE
 - Over 15+ years with multiple EHR generations
- LVHN is a full member of the Sequoia project



- Connect and share data with relevant Federal agencies: SSA, VA, DOD
- Connection to Carequality to share data with care providers using many different EHR vendors
- Multiple connections to HIE entities and capabilities
 - Sequoia, Epic Care Everywhere, Carequality, SureScripts DIRECT, PA P3N





LVHN – PA DOH Designated HIO



- LVHN granted provisional HIO Certification on July 7, 2021
- LVHN team collaborated with IBM and PA eHealth resources to interface the LVHN version of the HIO, and went live on the IBM P3N network on February 1, 2022 - and LVHN was officially recognized as a HIO
 - From 2/1/22 to 5/6/22 already shared **540,212** patient records
- New HIO IRIS technology vendor is cognosante
 - LVHN identified as 1 of 3 HIO's in first wave of P3N technical transition
 - Technical discovery meeting with IBM replacement, Cognosante, held on March 3, 2022
 - LVHN transition includes new ADT encounter service
 - Weekly calls with Cognosante and PA eHealth resources in process
 - Current highly aggressive timeline suggests transition may be completed the by end of June 2022



- Epic Care Link
 - Provides access to the LVHN Epic EHR to community practice partners, access patient records, PACS images, schedule encounters, and other functionality

The World Health Organization says a person's social determinants of health are defined by the distribution of money, power, and resources at global, national, and local levels, and are primarily responsible for health inequities.


SDOH can impact health outcomes and quality of life. The CDC recognizes 5 domains that influence a person's health and overall well-being through Healthy People 2030.

Social Determinants of Health (SDOH)

Many studies suggest that 30-55% of health outcomes are influenced by SDOH. Improving health and reducing health inequities relies on adequately addressing SDOH.

Project Management Office:

- 2. P3N Program Change Control Board reviews changes monthly
 - 1. Board is comprised of 3 P3N PA eHealth and 2 Cognosante voting members
- 3. Risk Management and Schedule Management
 - 1. Risk and issues are reviewed and updated at least weekly to approve mitigation plans
 - 2. Schedule is submitted to PA monthly and updated/reviewed at least weekly


Production Readiness & Operational Readiness:

- Transition Status with IBM
 - 1. Great collaboration with IBM during the first 3 months of the contract
 - 2. More detailed production cutover plan will be reviewed with IBM as part of production readiness planning and cutover planning (e.g. day by day, hour by hour, turning off feeds with HIOs and turning on production feeds to new P3N solution)
- 2. MPI Data migration
 - 1. Initial priority is on sample production data from HIOs
 - 2. MPI data migration to be completed closer to when PIX feeds will be enabled
 - 3. PIX feeds will be turned on in parallel to existing IBM production PIX feeds
- 3. P3N Maintenance and Operations Plan
 - 1. JAD sessions held and additional sessions will be scheduled
 - 2. First draft is in progress and we are on track to submit this draft deliverable on time
 - 3. Help desk is a focus to ensure smooth transition for all users







Schedule Metrics






HIO Onboarding and Lessons Learned

Key Improvements put in place:

- 1. Converted the weekly status meeting to an "onboarding" meeting
- 2. VPN forms several improvements put in place how to exchange them, what sections are a priority, QA/review process, what traffic/message types would go through which tunnel and new status tracking form for both VPN & mTLS connections
- 3. Double encrypted secure e-mail solutions → moved to a different secure solution and likely should have just created a secure folder/location for HIOs to use (similar to what was done with IBM)
- 4. Very optimistic start Early kickoff before our environments were fully established and before a strategy was made with regards to − parallel production feeds and which environments to connect (HIO → Cognosante)
- 5. Schedule expectations decision to focus initially on key milestone dates (e.g. establish connectivity in QA by 5/30) was not granular enough and a more robust schedule should have been agreed upon at the kickoff and reviewed weekly
- 6. Overall communications, cadence and process by which we will continue onboarding

PA eHealth Accomplishments

March 2022 – Trained Labor and Industry staff on use of the P3N Portal to improve disability determinations.

March 2022 – PA eHealth Annual Report for 2020-2021 was approved and provided to the General Assembly.

March 2022 – The \$18 million Resource and Referral Tool RFA (03-22) was released on the PA eMarketplace; HIO applications are due May 12, 2022.

April 2022 – PA eHealth provided an In-Person P3N overview and technical training for Department of Corrections health administrators.

May 2022 – CMS approved Pennsylvania's final five-year State Medicaid Health IT Plan (SMHP).

May 2022 – PA eHealth and Promoting Interoperability Program team recognized a finalist in the 2021 Governor's Award for Excellence.



PA eHealth Initiatives

Care Plans – PA eHealth is working to get various Department of Human Services program care plans integrated into the new P3N Care Plan Registry (i.e., OB Needs Assessment Form, PH/BH MCO Integrated Care Plan, Pediatric Shift Nursing care plan, etc.)

CRISP – PA eHealth continues to work with CRISP and the West Virginia Health Information Network (WVHIN) to expand interstate ADT sharing.

DHIN – The Delaware Health Information Network is interested in expanding its P3N interoperability beyond ADT sharing.

MNX – Mt Nittany Health has decided to close Mt. Nittany Exchange when the IBM P3N shuts down in July 2022.

HIE Onboarding Grants – The \$5 million HIE Onboarding Grant for select HHA (RFA 06-22) is in legal review.

EHR Incentive Grants – The \$7.8 million EHR Incentive Program for select HHA (RFA 12-22) is in legal review.



PA eHealth Initiatives (continued)

TEFCA – In January 2022, the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology (ONC) and the Sequoia Project have begun implementing the Trusted Exchange Framework and Common Agreement authorized by the 21st Century Cures Act of 2016. PA eHealth is evaluating becoming a Qualified Health Information Network (QHIN) or connecting to a QHIN.

The industry is still awaiting information from ONC's Recognized Coordinating Entity (Sequoia Project) regarding the QHIN application process and potential costs associated with becoming a QHIN.

Cognosante has provided a verbal recommendation to PA eHealth to pursue becoming a downstream participant in a QHIN, such as the National eHealth Exchange; PA eHealth is awaiting a written recommendation from Cognosante.



PA eHealth Retirement

Allen Price – After spending most of his career in private industry, Allen Price joined the Commonwealth in 2010 and has spent the last 10 years helping to build, grow, enhance, and maintain the Pennsylvania Patient and Provider Network (P3N). Allen has been an invaluable, constant, asset to the Pennsylvania eHealth Partnership Authority and the Pennsylvania eHealth Partnership Program in the Department of Human Services.
