

# 2020-21 INITIATIVES





#### INITIATIVES

### **Investing in Our Kids**

- \$15.3 million increase in federal funds to Child Care Works base rates
- \$2.5 million investment to increase county administrative allocations for Early Intervention

### **Repairing and Improving Our Infrastructure**

Increasing support for lead testing and harm reduction activities in places where children have been exposed to high levels of lead through the Lead Exposure Reduction Program





#### INITIATIVES

### Making Pennsylvania a Better Place for Workers and Businesses

- **\$14.8 million** additional federal dollars will be used to redesign employment and training programs
- **\$23.4 million** in federal funding for a work expense deduction to address the benefits cliff and create a pathway for Pennsylvania's families to work towards self-sufficiency
- **\$5 million** for a State Facility Closure Transition Fund will be established within the Department of Community and Economic Development to provide grants and loans to local municipalities affected by the permanent closure of a state-operated or state-owned facility
- Increasing the minimum wage to **\$15 per hour**





#### INITIATIVES

### **Protecting Our Most Vulnerable**

- **\$1.4 million** to increase reimbursements for Pennsylvanians who are on ventilators
- **\$1 million** to expand programs that provide legal services to vulnerable populations
- **\$1.2 million** in funding to establish a new direct care worker training program
- **\$4 million** to direct to our counties to support intellectual disability and autism programs
- **\$5.1 million** to increase funding for additional licensing and administrative staffing for the Department of Human Services





#### INITIATIVES

### **Protecting Our Most Vulnerable**

- **\$1.25 million** to move 20 Pennsylvanians who need high levels of care from state institutions and into community settings through the Community Hospital Integration Projects Program
- **\$15 million** to remove Pennsylvanians with an intellectual disability or autism from the emergency waitlist
- **\$2.4 million** in funding to support home visiting programs
- **\$1 million** in additional funding to combat food insecurity for 1.6 million Pennsylvanians through the Pennsylvania Agriculture Surplus System
- **\$1.3 million** boost to the Court Appointed Special Advocate Program, which seeks to ensure children who have experienced abuse or neglect have their voices heard in the courtroom
