**IMPORTANT REMINDER:** All providers must revalidate the Medical Assistance (MA) enrollment of each service location every 5 years. Providers should log into PROMISe to check the revalidation dates of each service location and submit revalidation applications at least 60 days prior to the revalidation dates. ### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this bulletin is to issue updated handbook pages that include the requirements for prior authorization and the type of information needed to evaluate the medical necessity of prescriptions for Cephalosporins submitted for prior authorization.

#### SCOPE:

This bulletin applies to all licensed pharmacies and prescribers enrolled in the Medical Assistance (MA) Program and providing services in the fee-for-service delivery system. Providers rendering services in the MA managed care delivery system should address any questions related to Cephalosporins to the appropriate managed care organization.

## **BACKGROUND:**

The Department of Human Services' (Department) Pharmacy and Therapeutics (P&T) Committee reviews published peer-reviewed clinical literature and recommends the following:

- Preferred or non-preferred status for new drugs in therapeutic classes already included in the Preferred Drug List (PDL);
- Changes in the status of drugs on the PDL from preferred to non-preferred and non-preferred;
- New quantity limits;
- Classes of drugs to be added to or deleted from the PDL; and
- New guidelines or revisions to existing guidelines to evaluate the medical necessity of prescriptions submitted for prior authorization.

#### DISCUSSION:

During the May 15, 2019, meeting, the P&T Committee recommended removing the amoxicillin-containing agents from the Cephalosporins and Related Agents PDL drug class. To accurately reflect the agents remaining in this class, the committee recommended changing the name of this PDL class to Cephalosporins. There are no other changes to the medical necessity guidelines.

The revisions to the PDL drug class and corresponding medical necessity guidelines were subject to public review and comment and subsequently approved for implementation by the Department.

# PROCEDURE:

The procedures for prescribers to request prior authorization of Cephalosporins are located in SECTION I of the Prior Authorization of Pharmaceutical Services Handbook. The Department will take into account the elements specified in the clinical review guidelines (which are included in the provider handbook pages in the SECTION II chapter related to Cephalosporins) when reviewing the prior authorization request to determine medical necessity.

As set forth in 55 Pa. Code § 1101.67(a), the procedures described in the handbook pages must be followed to ensure appropriate and timely processing of prior authorization requests for drugs that require prior authorization.

# MEDICAL ASSISTANCE HANDBOOK PRIOR AUTHORIZATION OF PHARMACEUTICAL SERVICES

# I. Requirements for Prior Authorization of Cephalosporins

# A. Revisions to Prescriptions That Require Prior Authorization

All prescriptions for a non-preferred Cephalosporin must be prior authorized.

# B. Revisions to Review of Documentation for Medical Necessity

In evaluating a request for prior authorization of a prescription for a non-preferred Cephalosporin, the determination of whether the requested prescription is medically necessary will take into account whether the beneficiary:

# 1. **One** of the following:

- Has a history of therapeutic failure, intolerance, or contraindication of the preferred Cephalosporins,
- b. Has culture and sensitivity test results documenting that only non-preferred Cephalosporins will be effective.

NOTE: If the beneficiary does not meet the clinical review guidelines above but, in the professional judgement of the physician reviewer, the services are medically necessary to meet the medical needs of the beneficiary, the request for prior authorization will be approved.

# C. Clinical Review Process

Prior authorization personnel will review the request for prior authorization and apply the clinical guidelines in Section B. above to assess the medical necessity of a prescription for a Cephalosporin. If the guidelines in Section B. are met, the reviewer will prior authorize the prescription. If the guidelines are not met, the prior authorization request will be referred to a physician reviewer for a medical necessity determination. Such a request for prior authorization will be approved when, in the professional judgment of the physician reviewer, the services are medically necessary to meet the medical needs of the beneficiary.
