PA TB Program Responsibility

The TB Program's responsibility is to prevent and control of the spread of TB.

- Set policies and procedures for TB control activities
- Manage the CDC cooperative agreement
- Surveillance and evaluation
- Training and education
- Ensuring public health laboratory services



PA TB Program Services

Services that are provided provided through financial support.

- Patient outpatient services
- TB clinicians
- Public health assistants
- Medications
- Clinic supplies
- Housing, food and other patient supports
- County/municipal health department programs



National TB Surveillance

2017 CDC National data

- 9,105 new cases of TB
- Decrease in TB cases of 1.6 percent
- National incidence rate 2.8 per 100,000
- Decrease of 2.3 percent from 2016
- 2,705 US born
- 6,384 non-US born




TB Infection Estimates

- Estimated that 257,000 individuals in Pennsylvania have TB infection
- Of those infected, approximately 172,000 are non-U.S. born
- This is based on just one methodology utilized by CDC to estimate TB infection prevalence



TB Morbidity in PA










2017 PA TB High Morbidity Areas


